When a sectional (excluding STaCs) or higher rated event is being conducted within 25 miles of a club game's playing site, the club is permitted to hold only its regularly scheduled club masterpoint games (i.e., no special games).

NAP and GNT News

Good luck to all the District 9 competitors who will be participating in the ACBL Finals of their flight of the North American Pairs at the Reno Spring NABC. You can watch their progress by reading the Daily Bulletins. Go to acbl.org, then you will find a link to the Reno NABC, either on the home page of ACBL, or click on Tournaments, then Upcoming NABCs, then Reno.

If you're not in the habit of reading the Daily Bulletins, you might want to start now. They're often quite enjoyable.

If your team has already qualified to play in the District Finals of the Grand National Teams, be sure you are aware of the location of your flight's finals. The Championship Flight (open to anybody) and the Flight A teams will play at the Mandel JCC, starting at 11 am on Saturday, April 30th. Flight A is for any player in good standing who was a member of District 9 on September 1st and whose masterpoint total was under 6000 at the August 6th running of masterpoint totals.

The Flight B and Flight C finals will be held at the St. Petersburg Bridge Club, starting at 1 pm on Saturday, April 30th. Flight B is for any player in good standing who was a member of District 9 on September 1st and whose masterpoint total was under 2500 at the August 6th running of masterpoint totals. Flight C is for any non-life master who is a member in good standing and was a member of District 9 on September 1st and whose masterpoint total was under 500 at the August 6th running of masterpoint totals.

You do not have to qualify with your teammates, but each of you must have qualified in a club qualifying game, between September 1st and March 31st. If you would still like to qualify, but you don't know of any games scheduled, ASK YOUR LOCAL CLUB MANAGER TO SCHEDULE A QUALIFYING GAME.

All but the Championship Flight team will receive financial subsidy to attend the ACBL Finals of the events at the Summer NABCs in Washington, DC.

YOUTH BRIDGE NABC WASHINGTON D. C. JULY 28-30, 2016

The District 9 Board of Directors has once again voted to help Florida Youth (age 19 or younger as of June 15th) get to the Youth NABC in WASHINGTON D.C. this summer, July 28th through July 30, 2016. The District will provide a stipend of an amount for expenses up to \$500 for each youth. The grant will be given to the applicant after the event and must be supported with receipts. If you are unable to advance the money for the trip, send a letter to Nancy Hagerty explaining the circumstances no later than April 22, 2016. The Board wants to be sure that no player is left out of the competition because of a lack of finances.

In order to qualify for the stipend, you must play in at least four of the six possible Youth NABC sessions available July 28-30. All youth seeking stipends must fill out the application below and send it to the District 9 Youth Advisor (Nancy Hagerty) no later than April 22, 2016.

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



Winning the 0-10,000 IMP Pairs at the Denver NABC

One of the cardinal rules of playing IMPs is that you rarely double part-scores, especially when that double would put the opponents in game if they made it. But when I got to play in the 0-10,000 IMP Pairs at the Fall NABC 2015 in Denver, Colorado with my good friend Spencer Jones, it was a doubled part-score contract that helped contribute to our win. We came into day 2 in next-to-last place with only 1 IMP of carryover, so we had to do some serious IMP gathering in both final sessions.

In the second final session (now in 5th place overall after a really good afternoon session and starting to look at actually winning it all a little more realistically), all nonvulnerable, second seat, I picked up:

▲ 8
♥ AJ109
◆ A8765
♣ 1074

RHO and I passed, LHO opened 1A, partner passed, and RHO bid 1NT semi-forcing. I doubled that for takeout and LHO bid 2A. Partner doubled that, showing significant values, and RHO corrected to 2A. I passed, and partner doubled for serious. Now it was time to buckle down and defend.


Partner led the ♦3 and the dummy showed up on my right with:

▲ J3
♥ Q8632
♦ KQ102
♣ J2

I won the ◆A, so now the game became "keep the declarer off the dummy!" I returned my ♣10, declarer finessed and partner won the ♣K, and trusting me to have both my bid and my advertised lack of ♣ honors, returned the ♥K. I ducked that with the ♥J, showing all these other honors surrounding the dummy's ♥Q, and he continued with a small ♥ which I won with the ♥A when declarer went up with the ♥Q.

Declarer had to follow to all these cards, and he had already lost 4 tricks. He tried to scramble some other tricks as I returned another ♥, but now that we had all our outside tricks, he had to contend with partner's AKT75. When those were combined with my fortuitous singleton ♠8, he lost 4 more tricks there in trump.

+500 for beating 2♠X by 3 tricks was good for more than 6 IMPS for us! The complete hand:


Results: Bids, projected results, and matchpoints of panel members are tabulated below. All panelists would have made the Unit 128 72% Club! Congratulations! 1. Mike and Pat both elected to pass, mostly out of concern of the flat shape and the vulnerability. Josh, Alan, and John all took action, recognizing the risk, but worrying about partner's lead against 1NT. Josh explained the advantage of his double, having already passed as dealer, is that if South had opening strength and could leave it in, a nice penalty could result. With the actual hand, South pulls to 2♦, and North closes out the bidding at 2♥.

2. All players other than John had a possible slam on their mind, and whether the cue bid was 4^{\bullet} or 4^{\heartsuit} , South, with the A will bid 4^{\bullet} , and 6^{\bullet} is reached. Mike, after bidding 4^{\bullet} , even planned to bid 4^{\heartsuit} over 4^{\bullet} to push partner one more time to bid 4^{\bullet} . Alan makes a good point for preferring 4^{\heartsuit} to 4^{\bullet} , as that emphasizes that the hand belongs to NS, whereas 4^{\bullet} might simply be a second suit. With 8 apparent tricks in the minors and Spades stopped, John Brady made an excellent 3^{\bullet} call looking for 3NT if partner can stop Hearts. This leads to 3NT by South (or 4NT if EW save in Hearts).

3. Everyone agreed with 3, and everyone but Josh doubled. Josh allowed for a thin 1, overcall by passing, arguing that South had the opportunity to double but did not. Alan points out the importance of getting +200 against the likely +140 in 3, 4 rates to be an unusual spot, so -130 and -710 may not be all that different.

Just the title alone can cause brain freeze. Yet, this is a quite common occurrence which can greatly improve your bidding. Let's see if we can figure out what this topic is all about. Here is a word-by-word breakdown...

Responder's -- That would be the partner of the opening bidder

Second-Round -- Not the responder's first call, but his second-round action

Two-Level -- On the 2-level (duh!) Cuebid -- A bid in the opponent's suit

How about some examples? In each auction below, South's second bid fits the subject of this article:

A)	West 1♠	North 1♦ Pass	East Pass Pass	South 1♥ 2♠
B)	West Pass	North 1♦ 1NT	East 1♥ Pass	South Dbl 2♥
C)	West 1♥	North 1♣ 1♠	East Pass Pass	South 1♦ 2♥
D)	West Pass	North 1♦ 2♣	East 1♠ Pass	South Dbl 2♠

What is South showing? Why is he making such a bid? We will get to that in a moment, but first let me differentiate the above auctions from the more common:

West	North	East	South
	1♦	1♥	2♥

This is a different animal. This is a firstround cuebid by responder. It has a very specific meaning. It shows (guarantees) support for opener. (After a 1♣ opening, usually 5+ card support. After a 1♦ opening, usually 4+ card support. After a 1♥ or 1♠ opening, at least 3-card support.) It shows at least 10 HCP. It is not forcing to game, but at least invitational.

Do not mix up that first-round cuebid raise with the 4 auctions A-B-C-D above. The cuebid on neither A, B, C nor D guarantees support for opener. Let's look at each of those 4 auctions and see what kind of a hand responder would have and why he would cuebid.

A)	West	North	East	South

Suppose that you (South) hold the following hand:

▲2 **♥**AQ8765 **♦**A32 **♣**A32

Your partner opens 1. You know your side has at least a game, maybe a slam. For now, you respond 1. This is met with a 1. overcall. Your partner passes, and it comes back to you. Now what? A double would not be penalty. It would show "cards." However, such doubles can be left in (and your partner, likely with 4 spades, might indeed choose to pass). What about other possibilities? 3^{W} would be only invitational. 4^{W} would just be a wild, unnecessary guess (picture partner with, say, $KI_{65} \ge 2$ KQ_{76}

What you want to do is tell partner: "I have a good hand. I am not sure where we belong. Please talk to me some more."

West	North	East	South
	1♦	Pass	1♥
1	Pass	Pass	2

The 2A cuebid here says exactly that. It says nothing about spades. It says nothing about your hearts (you might have only 4 of them). You might or might not have support for your partner. Consider another possible hand you might have for the 2th bid in the auction shown:

▲A ♥AK76 **♦**AQ765 **♣**432

You plan to next raise diamonds, forcing! Why is it forcing? Because to invite, you could have simply jumped to 3♦ from 1♠ without cuebidding first.

B)	West	North	East	South
		1♦	1♥	Dbl
	Pass	1NT	Pass	??

Suppose that you (South) hold the following hand:

▲AQ76 ♥5 **♦**AQ32 **♣**AK32.

Your partner opens 1. You know your side has at least a game, maybe a slam. They overcall 1. You start with a negative double (the first priority is to look for a 4-4 spade fit). Partner rebids 1NT as shown above. Now what? You could give up on slam and simply raise to 3NT. Partner could have an unattractive

▲J3 **♥**KQ76 **♦**K654 **♣**QJ4

Opposite such a minimum, slam is no bargain. On the other hand, partner could hold:

▲K2 **♥**AJ4 **♦**K10876 **♣**Q4

Opposite that hand, you belong in 7.

Partner could also have something in between, such as:

▲102 **♥**AQJ3 **♦**KJ54 **♣**Q54

Opposite that hand, $6 \blacklozenge$ is where you belong.

Should responder just guess on round 2? Should he use Blackwood? Well, he can't really use Blackwood, because 4NT would be a quantitative (invitational) raise. Yes, 4♣ (Gerber) would ask for aces, but what's the point? Knowing how many aces partner has won't tell you where you belong. What you want to do is hear more from partner. Use the 2♥ cuebid to create a force. With a 5-card

diamond suit, partner could now repeat them. With 3-card spade support, he could bid 2A. With nothing good to say, he can bid 2NT (over which you can bid 3 forcing and obtain even more input).

Must you have a slam try for your 2♥ bid in this auction? No. Here is another hand which would bid 2♥ in auction B:

▲AKQ2 **♥**A1076 **♦**J1084 **♣**2

You could just blast to 3NT, but what if partner held something like:

▲]54 ♥K]2 ♦AQ965 ♣Q5?

Suppose that you (South) hold the following hand:

▲AQ76 **♥**52 **♦**AKQ102 **♣**K2.

Your partner opens 1♣. You respond 1♠ (no need to bypass such a good suit when you have enough to introduce spades later). Atfer LHO overcalls 1♥, your partner bids 1♠. You belong in only a spade game opposite,say:

▲KJ106 **♥**Q876 **♦**3 **♣**AQJ4

But, you could easily belong in 6 or 7♠ opposite the right hand. Now what? Jumping to 3♠ (a common error by intermediatelevel players) is unacceptable. Why? Because partner can Pass! Jumps in previously bid suits are only invitational. You could jump to game in spades, but partner will never play you for this much. Best is to force with a cuebid of 2♥.

This says nothing about hearts. It doesn't promise spade support yet. You might have had a big hand with diamonds and delayed club support. You might be fishing for 3NT with a hand such as:

▲AQ **♥**765 **♦**AKQ65 **♣**654.

With that hand you would also produce a vecuebid. All partner knows is that you have a good hand. With hearts stopped, he will likely Please see page 30
